Bowhunter Jamboree Guidelines MARKED 3D

This will be a two-day tournament, with final results tabulated on one day's round. Participants may shoot either or both days; best score counts if shoot 2 rounds.

Archer does not have to be an IAA member to participate

Host Club will provide 40 targets with 12-ring scoring, set up on two courses with 20 targets each course.

Targets are to be set with no more than 15 degree angle.

Courses shall be set so that archers may exit at a minimum of half-way through the course for a break, or club must provide restroom facilities and refreshments half-way through the course. Club will provide sufficient water on the courses.

Yardage will be **marked** with maximum yardage as follows:

50 yards - Adult sighted classes

30 yards - Youth and unsighted classes (Traditional, Barebow, Competitive Bowhunter)

20 yards – Cub

Three shooting stakes will be provided as above:

All adult sighted classes

Youth and unsighted classes

Cub

Advertising will be the responsibility of the host club. The club will send a flyer to the State Secretary for publication at a minimum of two months in advance of the tournament.

The tournament will have a shotgun start. Archers will be assigned to targets in groups of at least three.

Classes with 10 or more participants will be flighted utilizing the NFAA flighting chart.

Awards will be furnished by the IAA:

First place in the Championship flight of each Class will receive a patch. Second and third place will receive medals. Flight winners placing first, second and third will receive medals. IAA archers participating will have their score added to the Championship award if they win their class.

Fees:

\$20.00 Adult & Young Adult \$10.00 Youth & Cub \$50.00 Family The financial split for this tournament will be 80% club, 20% IAA due to the cost of the 3D targets.

NFAA 3D rules will be followed:

hooting styles and classes will be in accordance with existing NFAA Style and Division equipment rules.

Scoring will be a 1 arrow format, scoring 12-10-8-5. There will be duplicate scoring. Two archers are chosen to be scorekeepers, one archer will call the value of the arrows, and one archer will be target captain. The target captain is responsible for the final decision on arrows if there is a questionable one.

Binoculars will be allowed

Ties will be broken by: # of 12 rings, if still tied, by # of 10's, then by # of 8's, etc.

Maximum bow speed of 300 feet per second, with a 3% variance Maximum draw weight will be 80 lbs.
