

## BOWHUNTER RONDEZVOUS GUIDELINES

### Updated 2009

Archer does not have to be an IAA member to participate

Host Club will provide a minimum of 30 unmarked targets, up to a maximum of 40 with 12-ring scoring.

Targets are to be set with no more than 15 degree angle.

All shots will be realistic "hunting situations", at a distance no greater than 40 yards for all shooters, with a maximum of 20 yards for the Cubs.

Three shooting stakes:

Cub & PeeWee

No sights (Traditional, Competitive Bowhunter, Barebow) and all classes of Youth Sights (All adult classes with sights)

Binoculars will be allowed – NO RANGEFINDERS

Advertising will be the responsibility of the host club. The club will send a flyer to the State Secretary for publication at least one month in advance of the tournament. Information must be sent by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month for mailing on the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month.

### **Scorecards:**

Host club will provide the scorecards for the tournament. Cost will be recorded on the financial sheet as club expense.

### **Awards will be the responsibility of the host club. Cost will be recorded on the financial sheet as a club expense:**

First place in the Championship flight of each Class will receive a plaque or trophy. Second and third place will receive pins or medals. Flight winners placing first, second and third will receive pins or medals. The host club can choose to use a plaque sponsored by the IAA for first place champions – cost will be recorded on the financial sheet as an IAA expense.

Ties will be shot off, method to be determined by the tournament chairman.

Maximum bow speed of 300 f.p.s

Maximum draw weight of 80 lbs. for men and 60 lbs. for women

Fees:

\$15.00 Adult & Young Adult

\$6.00 Youth & Cub – PeeWee is free

\$30.00 Family

\$45.00 Professional (\$30.00 to pro purse)

**Courses shall be set if possible so that archers may exit at a minimum of half-way through the course for a break, or club must provide restroom facilities and refreshments half-way through the course. Club will provide sufficient water on the courses.**
