FROM SARA'S SPOT:



The **IAA Outdoor State Target Championship** is a 900 round and may be shot one day or both days with the best score counting if shooting two rounds. It is coming up **September 11-12** at **Kennekuk County Park near Danville**, a beautiful 3,000 acre park containing 3 nature preserves and 170 acre Lake Mingo. It is bordered on the west by the Middle Fork National Scenic River and State Wildlife Area and Kickapoo State Park three miles to the south. It is an easy interstate trip 2 hours driving distance from Springfield, Peoria, Joliet; 2 ½ from Chicago; 3 from E. St. Louis, Dixon, Rockford; and 3 ½ from Freeport, Marion, or Quincy. The target range with new Morrell FITA bales will be on a flat, grass field where a vintage ball club obeying 1858 rules plays twice a year. Registration form is in the bulletin, on the IAA website, and on IAA Facebook. Don't miss the opportunity to shoot this one!

Bowhunting season is rapidly approaching and it is time to get your gear ready and your 2 member **whitetail hunt team** together. Team members do not have to be from the same club, but they do have to be IAA/NFAA members. The entry form for the team hunt and the big game application are in the bulletin.

A Board Meeting will be held September 19, 2021. This meeting will be held at Bloomington Public Library starting at 1:15 PM. Any interested IAA member is welcome to attend.

NFAA will host this year's [Hyundai Archery World Cup Final](#) in Yankton on September 29-30, immediately after the [Hyundai World Archery Championships](#). It is the **first time** the annual event will be **hosted in the USA** and the first time these two tournaments will run consecutively in the same location. The finals of the world championships will take place in broadcast sessions held over three days Sept. 24 to Sept. 26. The match bracket draw for the Hyundai Archery World Cup Final is expected to take place on Monday 27th, followed by live coverage of the event Sept. 29th and 30th.

900 ROUND**

ROUND: 900 ROUND BOTH DAYS

ADULTS &

YOUNG ADULTS: 30 arrows at 60 yards
30 arrows at 50 yards
30 arrows at 40 yards

YOUTH: 30 arrows at 50 yards
30 arrows at 40 yards
30 arrows at 30 yards

CUBS: 30 arrows at 30 yards
30 arrows at 20 yards
30 arrows at 10 yards

Archers shall be in groups of 4 on each target butt, no less than 3, no more than 5. Archers will shoot a double line at the discretion of the tournament chairman.

An END consists of six arrows.

The round will begin with two official practice ends.

Shooting will commence and end with a whistle blast. Several whistle blasts in rapid succession means that there is an emergent situation and stop shooting IMMEDIATELY.

SPOTTING AIDS MAY BE USED.

SCORING:	INNER GOLD	10	OUTER GOLD	9
	INNER RED	8	OUTER RED	7
	INNER BLUE	6	OUTER BLUE	5
	INNER BLACK	4	OUTER BLACK	3
	INNER WHITE	2	OUTER WHITE	1

Arrows must TOUCH the scoring line to be in the higher scoring area.

Arrows and scoring face are not to be touched until all arrows are scored and recorded.

SCORECARDS:

There will be duplicate scoring. Two archers are chosen to be scorekeepers, one archer will call the value of the arrows and one archer will be target captain. If there is any disagreement in the group as to the value of an arrow, the target captain will make the final decision.

The numeric value of each arrow, total end score and total round score shall be recorded. At the completion of the second day's round, the total score for both days shall be recorded.

Each archer is individually responsible for seeing that his arrows are called correctly and properly entered on the score cards and that his score cards are turned in to the proper officials signed by both scorers and the archer.

SHOOTING THE ROUND:

There will be a 5 minute time limit. At the discretion of the tournament chairman, the time limit may be extended based on weather conditions.

Unsuspected pass-throughs will be re-shot after all rounds have been completed for that day.

Any arrow that has passed through the target face in such a manner that it can easily be pushed back through and scored may be pushed back through after all arrows in the target have been scored and recorded – if all target mates are in agreement. If the arrow is hanging from the back of the target at an angle and cannot be easily pushed back through and scored, or if all target mates are not in agreement, this must be treated as an unsuspected pass-through and re-shot as above.

If an arrow should hang from the scoring face, shooting shall be interrupted and a field official shall immediately re-insert the arrow in its proper place in the scoring face. If the arrow falls or bounces from the target face it will be re-shot as above.

Hits on the wrong target shall score as misses.

If an archer shoots less than six arrows at 60 and 50 yards, or less than 3 arrows at 40 yards, he may shoot the remaining arrows if the omission is discovered before the end is officially completed. Otherwise, they shall score as misses.

If an archer shoots more than the prescribed number of arrows in one end, only the lowest arrows shall score.

In case of equipment failure, verified by the range captain, the archer will have 45 minutes for repair, and one practice end to re-sight. Missed ends will be made up at the completion of the round for that day.

An archer is not entitled to repeat a shot unless the mis-shot arrow can be reached by the bow from the archer's position on the shooting line.

If a target butt falls before an end is scored, that end will be re-shot by all archers on that target butt after the completion of the round for that day.

Archers may not make up lost ends or arrows except as specified.

FLIGHTING:

NFAA flighting system will be used for class/styles with 10 or more archers.

For a two day tournament: Archers will be placed in flights after the first day's round is completed, and will remain in these flights for the duration of the tournament.

For a one-day tournament: Archers will be placed in flights at the conclusion of the tournament.

TIES:

For a two day tournament: All ties for awards will be shot off at maximum distance – one end of three arrows scored inside out. If still tied, then arrow by arrow sudden death.

For a one day tournament: Ties for awards will be broken by scoring the last two ends at 60 yards inside/out. Duplicate awards will be given if the archers remain tied on inside/out scoring.

A. Any other type of Big Game Animal NOT commonly found in the territorial boundaries of the United States, but declared Big Game on an INTERNATIONAL LEVEL will be considered for an award, providing that such Big Game was taken legally and is not on the ENDANGERED SPECIES LIST of the U.S. Government, and that the PELT of said animal can legally be brought into this country.

B. That the governing body of this Association will have the right to disqualify any such animal that does not meet the requirements listed in Paragraph A

C. That all Big Game animals submitted for an award be submitted with substantial proof of the kill:

1. That a picture of the animal and the signature of witness, warden, forest ranger, conservation officer or police officer be present on all applications.

2. If for any reason Paragraph C, Item 1 cannot be complied with, a letter of explanation must accompany all applications giving full details and circumstances as to why.

3. If you hunted with a reputable and licensed guide, a letter of acknowledgment of the taking of any Big Game will be accepted in place of the above mentioned signatures.

D. A PICTURE MUST ACCOMPANY ALL APPLICATIONS.

BOWHUNTING FAIR CHASE RULES DEFINED:

Any animal taken under any of the following circumstances shall not be considered for any award: "YARDED" IN DEEP SNOW, HELPLESS IN WATER, HELPLESS ON ICE, HELPLESS IN TRAP, WHILE CONFINED BEHIND FENCES AS ON GAME FARMS, ETC., IN DEFIANCE OF GAME LAWS OR OUT OF SEASON. No animal shall be taken by "Jack Lighting"- shining at night from a power vehicle or power boat. Any other method considered by the N.F.A.A. or I.A.A. Bowhunting Committee to be UNSPORTSMANLIKE

ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility for the **Art Young Award** is limited to members of the **NFAA** at the time taken. There shall be no geographical restrictions, either as to the residence of the claimant, or to the location in which the game is secured.

AWARDS: **Art Young Big Game Pin** and a **NFAA Big Game Patch** shall be given for the first example of each species taken with the bow & arrow according to NFAA rules, for a processing fee.

NFAA FAIR CHASE RULES: Any animal taken under any of the following circumstances should not be considered for an **NFAA Art Young Big Game**

Award: "Yarded" in deep snow; helpless in water; helpless on ice; helpless in trap, while confined behind fences, as on a game farm, etc.,

in defiance with game laws or out of season; "Jack Lighting" or shining at night; from power vehicle or power boat; any other method considered by the **NFAA** Bowhunting Committee as unsportsmanlike.

SUB-SPECIE: Allow sub-specie of deer including Whitetail, Mule, Blacktail, Sitka, Coues, and Fallow as different big game animals.

APPLICATION MUST BE PRESENTED WITHIN (1) ONE YEAR OF TAKING BIG GAME AND ACCOMPANIED BY \$5.00 PROCESSING FEE FOR EACH APPLICATION.
